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The Code4SP Final Events

The Code4SP Platform, along with our National and International Forums, will continue to remain active, offering exceptional training opportunities and ongoing support.

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## The Code4SP project is closing with great success.



At an early stage, the national Code4SP pilot testing activities (stage 1: implementation) focused on engaging end users, including migrants, refugees, NEETs, and early school leavers. Following thorough evaluation and monitoring, accompanied by an upgrade of all project materials, Code4SP has now introduced specially-designed Live Labs. These labs target policy makers, policy-implementing institutions, and enterprises in need of coders, as well as talent recruiters specializing in the IT sector.

During the Live Labs, participating organizations received comprehensive training on the Code4SP methodology and learned the necessary steps to integrate this approach into their daily operations. The goal was to collaboratively develop the “Code4SP national suggestive template on policy reform.” IT coaches, mentors, and graduates from stage 1 led the training sessions.



Upon completing the Live Labs, a new round of training began, utilizing the upgraded materials and the Code4SP Moodle platform. This training involved participants sent by the policy-making and implementing organizations that attended the Live Labs. All participating entities were encouraged to sign local protocols or Memoranda of Understanding (MoU) with the Code4SP consortium to ensure the transferability, adaptation, and sustainability of the proposed methodology.

## Local Dissemination Events: Celebrating Achievements

The local dissemination events have begun to take shape in each partner country, with **Portugal** leading the way by organizing a major event. At the end of May, our Portuguese partners, SPEL and CEPROF, hosted their final dissemination event. This event showcased our project and its results to a full auditorium, marking a significant milestone in our journey.

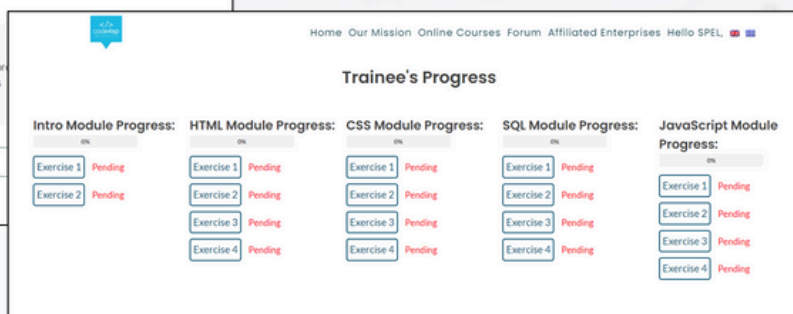
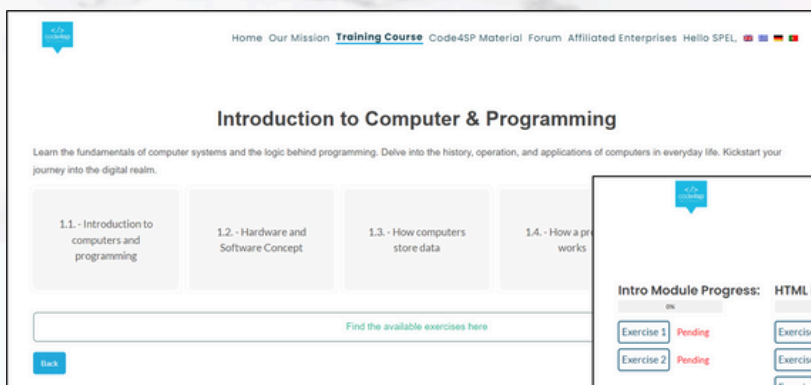
